# Lesson Seven: The Present Tense Verb in the State of Jazm [جَزُم]

#### PRINCIPLE ONE

The following five particles, when placed before the *present tense verb*, cause it to enter the *state* of *jazm* (جَزْم)<sup>20</sup>:

- إنْ (1
- كَمْ (2
- لَمَّا (3
- 4)  $J^{21}$
- 5) ¥22

#### PRINCIPLE TWO

Recall that changes in *grammatical state* are reflected at the end of a word by either (1) changes in voweling or (2) changes in lettering. If the *present tense verb* ends with a *dammah* ( ) in the *state* of *rafa'* (رفع), the *dammah* is changed to a *sukūn* ( ) to reflect the *state* of *jazm* (عزم). If the verb ends in a *nūn* ( ن ) in the *state* of *rafa'* (رفع), the *nūn* ( ن ) is dropped to reflect the *state* of *jazm* (عزم) [table 7.1].

#### PRINCIPLE THREE

The two stateless (مَبْني) conjugations of the present tense verb (i.e., the second and third person feminine plurals) never enter states (lesson five,

principle five). The five particles that cause the state of jazm (جُزْم) do not alter these two conjugations, and the final nūn on each of these conjugations does not drop from the end of the verb (table 7.1).

## PRINCIPLE FOUR

The particle مُرْم is used as a model to illustrate the state of jazm (جَزْم). This particle changes the verb from its default state of rafa' (رفْع) to the state of jazm (جَزْم). Furthermore, it alters the meaning of the verb by (1) changing the present tense to the past tense and (2) negating it. Thus لُمْ يَفْعَلُ (he does) becomes لَمْ يَفْعَلُ (he does) becomes لَمْ يَفْعَلُ

### ESSENTIAL NOTE

The conjugations of the *present tense verb* in the *state* of *jazm* (جَزْمُ) must be memorized (*table 7.2*) before moving to the next lesson.
